We would like to encourage everyone to take care of and maintain what we have so that they will last as long as possible. We remind you to drive your ATV's on the road and not the shoulder, be mindful of heavy equipment and semi-trucks traversing the shoulders, put your garbage cans right to the edge of the asphalt, and do not drag trees, stumps, rocks, etc. on the roadway in any manner. The best option is to haul your loads in trucks and trailers. Any damage caused reduces the life of the roadway and could potentially be charged to you.

The limb yard is a great privilege to our citizens. We ask

that when you use it, haul items appropriately in trucks and trailers, and only drop off branches, limbs and sticks. Signs of appropriate matter are also posted at the yard. Due to EPA standards, anything dropped of other than what's listed above, such as trash, lumber, etc., the limb yard could face closure if guidelines are not followed. Monroe City provides this service free to its citizens, so please don't abuse it.

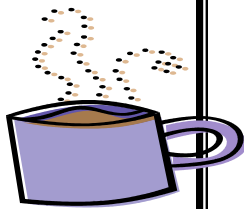

1st -\$50 2nd -\$25 3rd-5th- \$10

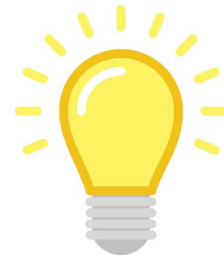
All customers who decorate with at least 50' of lights will receive a 10% credit on their electric bill.

The Monroe City Volunteer Fire Department is currently accepting applications for new members of the volunteer fire department. New members must be at least 21 years of age. They must be in good health, must reside in the South Sevier Fire

Protection area and be able to respond to a fire call 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Must certify in Fire Fighter I and Fire Fighter II training, Hazmat Awareness and Operations and be Wildland Red Card certified at next available county training. A background check is required.
