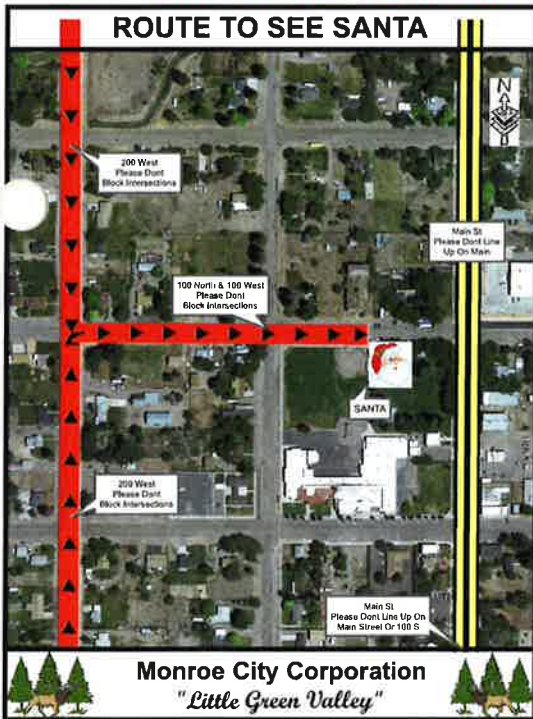

Monroe City Business Licenses:

If you are currently or looking into conducting a business in Monroe City you will need to hold a valid Monroe City Business License. If you are conducting a home office business (no customers coming to your home) you do not need a license unless you request one.

Examples of home office licenses are:

**Online sales
Medical Coding
Data input**

If you are wanting to conduct a business and have customers coming to your home, but live outside of the commercial zone, you will need to fill out an application for a conditional use license and come before the Monroe City Planning Commission and get approval from the Monroe City Council.

Examples of conditional use licenses are:

**Beauty Salons
Daycares
Preschools**

Licenses are valid for 1 calendar year. January-December. If you register your business in July, you will still need to renew it in January for the following year.

2021 fee for a Monroe City Business license is \$25.00.
